

# His Indenture

made the first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six Between John Day of the parish of Reading in the County of Wiltshire and Lydia Haskell of the parish of Whittington in the said County of Wiltshire Thomas James Haskell late of the parish of Whittington aforesaid but now residing in the City of Paris in the Kingdom of France Thomas Swell of Exeter in the said County of Wiltshire the said Lydia Haskell, Joseph Haskell late also of the parish of Whittington aforesaid but now

also residing in the City of Paris aforesaid Gentlemen the said Thomas Swell the said Lydia Haskell Joseph Haskell and Thomas James Haskell and Thomas Swell the said x x x x x Joseph Haskell, Edward Wise of Exeter aforesaid Brewer and William Wise of Exeter in the County of Wiltshire Esquire and the said Edward Wise of the one part and George Kemp of Reading in the said County of Wiltshire of the other part Witnesses that the said several persons parties hereto of the one part for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings of lawful British money to each of them paid by the said George Kemp at or before the execution of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby respectively acknowledge Have and each and every of them Hath and according to their several and respective Estates and Interests in the hereditaments hereinafter described bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth according to their respective Estates and Interests bargain and sell unto the said George Kemp and his executors administrators and assigns All that Messuage or tenement now and as two tenements with the outbuildings outhouses and appurtenances hereunto belonging situate lying and being within the liberty of the Town of Reading aforesaid and called or commonly known by the name of Walter late in the occupation of David King Esquire or his under tenants and now of David King or his under tenants together with all other fixtures outbuildings cisterns buildings ways paths passages waters watercourses rights customs profits privileges and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining And the reversion and reversions remainders and remainder yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and of every part thereof To have and to hold the said messuage or tenement and hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herebefore described and hereby or intended to be hereby bargained and sold with their appurtenances unto the said George Kemp his executors administrators and assigns from the day next before the day of the date of these presents for and during and unto the full end and term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be complete and ended Yielding and Paying therefore at the end of the said term unto persons parties hereto of the one part the rent of one penny and four (if the same shall be lawfully demanded) To the intent and purpose that by virtue of these presents and by force of the Statute made for transferring lands into possession the said George Kemp may be in the actual possession of all and singular the said hereditaments and premises herebefore described and hereby or intended to be hereby bargained and sold and be thereby enabled to accept and take a grant and release of the reversion reversions and under tenants thereof to him his heirs and assigns to and upon a just title and to and for such ends intents and purposes as are mentioned and expressed in a certain Indenture of release already and prepared and intended to bear date the day next after the day of the date of these presents and made between the said John Day of the one part the said Lydia Haskell Thomas James Haskell and Thomas Swell of the other part the said Lydia Haskell Joseph Haskell Thomas James Haskell and Thomas Swell of the one part the said Lydia Haskell Joseph Haskell Thomas James Haskell and Thomas Swell of the other part the said Joseph Haskell of the first part the said Edward Wise and William Wise of the sixth part the said Edward Wise of the seventh part the said George Kemp of the eighth part and William Holf of Exeter aforesaid Gentleman of the ninth part In witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
