

Peace Celebrations

A public meeting of the inhabitants of Brading was called by Mr. J. H. Oglaude, as Chairman of the Parish Council with reference to above & this was duly held on 10th June 1919 at the New Town Hall when it was unanimously resolved that peace should be celebrated in Brading and that all demobilized men should be given a lighted and all the inhabitants a tea ~~at~~ if the funds permitted. A Com: was formed to carry out the necessary arrangements.

The Tea for the men took place in the Parish Hall on 9th July and was a great success in no small measure due to the very generous & hard work carried out by the lady members of the Committee. The Entertainment which followed in the New Town Hall was also very successful.

On July 19th a tea for the inhabitants took place at Brunwell and as the day turned out very wet, Mr. Oglaude to whom our thanks are due, kindly allowed the children in batches to have their tea in the

Hall but the Adults were not so fortunate, had to be content with shelter provided by the trees.

The Com: desire to heartily thank all the generous subscribers to the fund and also those, and they are many, who helped in any way to enable them to carry out successfully the above arrangements.

The Total amount collected was £60.4.5 and the actual expenditure £47.12.5 leaving a balance of £12.12.0 and the Committee await instructions as to the disposal of this amount.
