Victoria by the Grace of God of the United
Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith To
all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting Whereas
William Burst Marster Gardener and William Seymour Baker Baileys
and Inhabitants of the Town of Brading in the Isle of Wight have
by their Petition under their hands and sealed with the seal of the
said Town bearing date the thirty first day of March in the
Thirty third year of our reign humbly represented unto us that
some time since it was agreed between Sir Henry Eglander of
Munwell in the Isle of Wight Baronet and the Petitioners predecessors
in Office that the Petitioners should convey to the said Sir Henry
Eglander certain messuages and lands belonging to them adjoining
to the Estate of the said Sir Henry Eglander in the Isle of Wight
aforesaid and should release all their claim to any contribution
from the owner or occupier of any lands of the said Sir Henry Eglander
towards the payment of a fee farm rent of Two pounds Thirteen
shillings and four pence charged on the said Town and payable by the
Baileys and Inhabitants thereof and that the said Sir Henry
Eglander should convey to the said Baileys and Inhabitants their
successors and assigns two pieces or parcels of land theretofore parts of
a Close called Turlong situate at Brading aforesaid Together with
the messuages and Buildings thereon and which said premises
were demised by the said Sir Henry Eglander to James Jacobs and
William Pain respectively for terms of one thousand years severally
at rentals amounting to Ten pounds fourteen shillings annually and
that the said Sir Henry Eglander should grant unto the said Baileys
and Inhabitants their successors and assigns a clear yearly rent
charge of Twenty pounds six shillings to be charged upon certain
lands situate at Brading aforesaid and numbered 351. 352. 375
378 and 379 on the Ordnance map for the said parish of Brading
to be payable by equal halves yearly payments (one rental and
rent charge making a yearly income of Sixty one pounds) That
the necessary Drafts for carrying the above stated arrangements into
effect had been prepared The petitioners therefore humbly prayed that
we would be pleased to grant them a license to acquire and hold

the said lands rent charge and hereditaments so agreed to be conveyed
to them by the said Sir Henry Ogleander as aforesaid We taking the
premises into our Royal consideration are graciously pleased to
comply with the request of the said Petitioners KNOW YE &
therefore that we of our especial grace certain knowledge and
mere motion HAVE given and granted and by these presents for us
our heirs and successors DO give and grant unto the said William
Bull and William Seymour and their successors Baileys and
Inhabitants of the Town of Bradnig in the Isle of Wight our especial
license full power and lawfule and absolute authority to purchase
acquire receive take and hold in Mortmain in perpetuity or other
estate to or for the use and benefit of or in trust for the said Baileys
and Inhabitants their successors and assignes the said two pieces or
parcels of land heretofore parts of a Close called Purlongs situate at
Bradnig aforesaid together with the messuages and buildings thereon
and which said premises were devised by the said Sir Henry Ogleander
to James Jacobs and William Pain respectively for terms of one thousand
years severally at rentals amounting to two pounds fourpence shillings
annually and also a clear yearly rent charge of Twenty pounds
six shillings to be charged upon certain lands situate at Bradnig
aforesaid and numbered 351. 352. 375. 378 and 379 on the
Briduance Map of the said Parish of Bradnig (such rentals and
rent charge making a yearly income of Thirty one pounds) And
we do hereby for us our heirs and successors give and grant unto
the said Sir Henry Ogleander and all and every other person and
persons bodies politic and corporate (otherwise competent) their heirs
executors administrators and successors our especial license full
power and lawfule and absolute authority to grant alien convey
and dispose of in Mortmain in perpetuity or other estate to or for
the use and benefit of or in trust for the said Baileys and Inhabitants
of the Town of Bradnig aforesaid and their successors the said pieces
or parcels of land rent charge and other hereditaments and premises
heretofore mentioned or referred to And lastly we do hereby
for us our heirs and successors grant unto the Baileys and Inhabitants
of the said Town of Bradnig and their successors that these our
Letters patent or the Inrolment thereof shall be in and by all things

good form valid sufficient and effectual in the law according to the
true intent and meaning thereof notwithstanding the not fully
describing the said lands hereditaments and premises or any of them
or any other omission imperfection defect matter cause or thing
whatever to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding
It witness whereof we have caused these our Letters to be made
patent Witness ourself at our palace at Westminster the Thirteenth
day of June in the thirty fourth year of our Reign
