Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 29th October 1885 I have the honour to inform you that the Commissioners have instructed their Assistant Commissioner Mr. Arthur Cardew to hold a public inquiry at Brading for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act 1883 (46 & 47 Vict. c. 18.)

Mr. Cardew proposes to open the inquiry at 12 o'clock ~~on the~~ noon of Tuesday the 26th instant, and I am to request you to be so good as to inform me, at your earliest convenience, whether that arrangement is one to which there appears to be any serious objection.

I am also to request you to inform me, at the same time, what public building, suitable for the purpose, can be placed, free of charge, at the disposal of the Assistant Commissioner for the purpose of this inquiry. It is desirable that sitting accommodation should be provided for those who attend.

The Commissioners will require that

The hand-bills for this purpose will be printed and sent to you by this Office; but the expense, if any, of distributing them, and the costs of at least one insertion of a very short advertisement in each of two local Newspapers must be borne by the property which is the subject of the inquiry.

I am accordingly to request you to state in your reply to this letter the names and days of publication of two Newspapers of opposite politics, if possible, having the principal circulation in Brading.

On receiving your reply to this letter, to which your early attention is most particularly requested, I will forward to you a copy of the requisite advertisement.

The charges of the Assistant Commissioner in respect of this inquiry will be paid by this office.
