## Coronation Festivities (Brading)

 Minutes of the Tea Committee 9/4/37At a meeting of the Tea Committee held in the Church Hall Brading on Friday April $9^{\text {th }} 1937$ Present Mrs H Stay, Mrs I W Pain, Mrs F C Corbett, Mrs E A Simmonds, Mrs C W Corbett, and Messrs V R Redstone and F C Corbett

Mr Corbett said he had been requested by the General Committee to convene the meeting of the Tea Committee. The first business would be to elect a Chairman

Chairman Mr Redstone proposed Mrs F C Corbett, seconded and it was unanimously resolved That Mrs H Stay be Chairman of the Tea Committee

Secretary and Treasurer Mr Redstone proposed that the positions of Secretary and Treasurer be combined and that Mr F C Corbett be appointed to fill those posts. Mrs C W Corbett sec'd and it was carried unanimously.

Tea Sub Committee The Secretary suggested that a Tea Subcommittee be elected to deal with ordering provisions and other matters of detail as done in connection with the Silver Jubilee. Mrs F A Simmonds proposed, Mrs F C Corbett seconded and it was unanimously resolved that such a committee be appointed, the members of same to be Mrs H Stay, Mrs I W Pain and Messrs V R Redstone J Riddick and the secretary (F C Corbett)

Teas to be in the New Town Hall and Church Hall It was decided that the Teas be provided in the New Town Hall and, subject to the necessary permission in the Church Hall
Gas Copper The Secretary was requested to communicate with the Ryde Gaslight Company as to loan and fixing of several Gas Coppers 3 in the Town Hall and 1 in the Church hall

## Crockery etc

Tea plates
That both the Congregational and the Methodist Churches be asked if they would loan some crockery This, with that belonging to the Halls, was considered would be sufficient. The Secretary said the Congregational Church would be pleased to help in the matter and he would find out about the Methodist church.


## Seats and Tables

Mrs F A Simmonds undertook to ask Mr Simmonds if he would be good enough to loan some boards and trestles for the tables. Also decided to ask the Congregational and Methodist Churches for loan of Seats and Tables also Table Cloths, Mrs Riddick to be asked if she could lend Table Cloths, Waitresses to bring their own Tea Cloths also Jugs
Urns $\quad$ With regard to Urns it was thought there were two at the Town Hall, Mrs Pain would find two and 1 at the Congregational Church, Jugs or Tea Pots would probably be used as well
Cartage
Resolved to employ Mr Duffett for Cartage of Seats etc
Paid Assistants
Resolved that Mrs F Wright act as Caretaker of Town Hall and Mrs Jackson at the Church Hall for the day (Former to be paid 15/- and latter 10/-) Washers up: - Mrs Hinks, Mrs Stephens, Mrs Webb and Mrs G Wheeler. Should either of these decline Miss Pocock (Fernside) or Mrs Elliott to take their places
Coal Resolved that 1 cwt Coal be supplied for the Church Hall
Cutting up etc As to voluntary assistants for cutting up and assisting at the tables for Tea in addition to the members of the ladies on the committee, it was left to the Chairman and the Secretary to get out a list of those prepared to assist.
Additions to Tea Committee Mr Redstone moved, Mrs Pain seconded, and it was unanimously resolved: - that Mrs H R Hale, Mrs Black and Mrs George Shaw be added to the Tea committee. The Secretary to purchase Kitchen Paper and Drawing pins for tables at Children's' Tea
Submissions to the General Committee At the Silver Jubilee 700 were catered for at teas. $£ 25$ was allotted to the Tea Committee. General Committee to be asked what amount is to be allotted for Coronation Teas
General Committee to be consulted as to times of Teas and numbers to be sent down from time to time to the Halls
Could the School children and say 50 adults come down about 4 o'clock See if remainder could be accommodated in one relay.
