in the Town Hall on 31 March 1914 at 8.0 pm

Furnace for Heating the Church.

"The Rev Hampton Weekes mentioned that
"it was contemplated heating the Church with hot
"Water pipes and that it was proposed to erect the
"Furnace House adjoining the North End of the Town
"Hall and he desired to know if The Trust would
"agree to the Wall of the Town Hall being used to
"form one end of such house. On the proposition
"of Mr. Cox seconded by Mr. Bown this was agreed to
"Subject to the approval of the plans by the Chairman
"and to the Church undertaking to do all work that
"may be found necessary by way of underpinning
"or otherwise strengthening the Wall & to repay to
"The Trust any additional Fire Insurance
"premium that may have to be paid by The Trust
"in consequence of such erection
