Dear Sir, or Madam,

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (WAR ADDITION) AMENDMENT ACT, 1919.

We have to draw your attention to the further increase in the Compensation to Injured Workmen awarded by the above-mentioned Act of Parliament, as from 1st January, 1920.

A copy of Clause 1 of the Act is annexed.

The effect of this Clause is to increase the Weekly Compensation payable for total disablement, as follows:—

FROM TWENTY-FIVE PER CENT. additional to the amount awarded by the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906,

TO SEVENTY-FIVE PER CENT. additional to the amount awarded by the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906.

In order to provide for the payment of this additional Compensation under your

POLICY No. N. 24370

we have pleasure in informing you that this Corporation has decided to undertake the cost of this added liability by granting a full indemnity for AN ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF 10% ON YOUR PRESENT PREMIUM.

The Act also confers a RETROSPECTIVE liability on Employers, seeing that the additional Compensation is payable as from 1st January, 1920, to Claimants injured before that date. The Corporation will undertake this retrospective liability without additional charge to that stated above.

It is calculated that the additional cost in claims will very considerably exceed the extra premiums we shall receive.

To avoid correspondence, UNLESS WE HEAR FROM YOU TO THE CONTRARY, it will be assumed that you desire the additional liability to be covered, and claims will be paid accordingly.

The additional premium payable as from 1st January, 1920, will be collected when the usual adjustment is made at the end of the year's insurance.

THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (WAR ADDITION) AMENDMENT ACT, 1919.

Clause 1.

'1. As from the commencement of this Act the additional weekly sum payable under the Workmen's Compensation (War Addition) Act, 1917 (in this Act referred to as "the War Addition Act"), shall, instead of being a sum equal to one-quarter of the amount of the weekly payment, be a sum equal to three-quarters of the amount of the weekly payment.'

NOTICE TO POLICYHOLDERS.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE

FOR

DISABLED SAILORS, SOLDIERS AND AIRMEN.

The Corporation has entered into an undertaking with **His Majesty's Government** to insure **Disabled Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen** in its Policies on the same terms as able-bodied persons, and not at any time to charge any higher trade or other rate of premium in consequence of their employment.

In order that this undertaking may be carried out, the Corporation is required by the **Government** to obtain **Separate Wages Returns** for **Disabled Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen**, and Employers are therefore requested to make such provision in their Wages Books as will enable them to divide their Wages Returns as follows:—

- (a) Wages of Disabled Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen.
- (b) Others.

This arrangement is to come into force as from the **1st January, 1920.**

All men in Receipt of a Disability Pension from the Ministry of Pensions are regarded as **Disabled Men** for the purposes of the **Government Scheme** under which the undertaking is given; and the Employer can verify whether a man is a disabled man to whom the Scheme applies by asking him to produce the Identity Certificate or "Ring Paper" which he receives from the Ministry of Pensions and which shows whether he is in receipt of Pension on account of Disablement.

His Majesty's Government particularly desire that, in asking for the production of the Certificate, the Employer should explain clearly to the man the fact that it is asked for under **Government Instructions** and for the purposes only of the **Government Scheme** to facilitate the employment of Disabled Men, and also the reasons why it is asked for; and that it should not be asked for until after the man has been engaged, and it is important that no ground should be given for any suggestion that it is used to the detriment of the Disabled Man.
