

At the Quarterly Meeting of the Directors
and acting Guardians of the Poor within the Isle
of Wight held at the Guildhall of the Borough of
Newport on Thursday the 30th of December 1830.
The Right Hon^{ble} Lord Yarborough in the Chair.

It was Resolved

That a copy of the Resolutions entered
into at the Quarterly Meeting on the 30th Day of
September last be sent to the Vestry Clerk of Brading
to be by him laid before the Vestry in reply to the
Resolutions of the Vestry transmitted to the present
Meeting on the subject of certain poor Children
being apprenticed to Persons resident in Canada
or Elsewhere.

Sept^r 30th 1830.

That it is desirable to afford facilities
for emigrating to Canada or elsewhere to the
young persons at present in the House as a
prospective measure to relieve the increasing
population of this Island.

That the apprentice fund be considered
a fund applicable to the above purposes.

That a sum not exceeding twelve Pounds
per head be allowed to individuals taking out
such young persons under a guarantee to perform
such agreements as may be hereafter deemed expedient

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That the said young persons be bounden
Masters by Indenture with a bondsman resi-
dent in England as additional security for
the fulfillment of the terms thereof, and for the
return of the Money in case of their coming
back again before its conclusion.

That five Boys and one Girl who may
be willing to go out to Canada, and whose parents
are willing that they should do so, be apprenticed
to Mr Cull on his finding a sufficient bondsman
for the performance of the Indentures.

That ten Pounds be allowed as passage
to Mr Cull, the same sum if necessary for
passage Money, and two Pounds laid out in
the outfit of each individual by the Guardians.
